Community Health Alliance, in partnership with LIBERTY Dental Plan, is offering Mobile Dental Program clinics throughout October for pediatric patients aged 0-20. Services include exams, cleanings, x-rays, fluoride treatments, and more. Clinics will be held on October 1, 17, 24, and 29 at their Neil Road and Sun Valley locations.
